Allied Health CTE Career Cluster: Health Science

WHAT TO KNOW

This is a one-year program designed to explore the allied health career field. Allied Health provides students an overview of the many career options within the healthcare industry. Major components include anatomy, physiology, medical terminology, and a professional clinical experience. Allied Health offers students handson experience with clinical and technical skills such as CPR, first aid, monitoring vital signs and basic personal care needs of the patient. Other areas of focus include phlebotomy, massage therapy, sports medicine, basic EKG's and career readiness skills. Qualified students may be eligible to return for the Advanced Allied Health course and choose Certified Nurse Aide (CNA), Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) or Phlebotomy.

CLASSROOM AND PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Some highlights of the program are Articulated Credit with Post-Secondary Institutions, may meet Michigan Merit Curriculum finalyear math experience graduation requirement, fundamental health care skills, exploratory clinical rotation in the health care field and safety and infection control. Classroom activity consist of bedmaking, First Aid and CPR, obtaining vital signs, patient care, activities for daily living, transferring and ambulating patients, communications and work-ethnic skills, medical terminology and medical abbreviations.
